

Because evaluation of the inside of your eyes – the retina – is an essential part of every comprehensive eye examination, dilation of the pupils is usually necessary. An undilated retinal exam compromises the ability to see the entire retina. Pupil dilation, however, creates many inconveniences for you, including the inability to see clearly and the need to use sunglasses for many hours after the exam.

Broadway Vision Source has therefore acquired a new retinal imaging technology, which enables us to perform retinal evaluations more thoroughly and efficiently, in most cases without the need for pupil dilation. It is fast, safe, and comfortable.

This technology – called Optomap – enables us to better detect any problems and also permits us to photodocument (the creation of a permanent photographic record) your retinal image for future medical reference.

We strongly recommend having an Optomap performed – or having your pupils dilated - for all patients, of all ages, during each comprehensive eye examination. However, because vision insurance does not cover advanced screening procedures such as Optomap, this is an out-of-pocket expense. This additional fee is \$29.00.
